PASTOR TO PEOPLE

By the time you have read the newsletter, Ash Wednesday will have occurred and the season of Lent will have begun. The season of Lent is the forty days, not counting Sundays, leading up to Easter Sunday. Historically, this time has been a period of fasting, prayer, and preparation for baptism. This Lenten season, instead of following the scripture lessons assigned for each Sunday, the sermons will focus on a specific area of our membership vows of the United Methodist Church. So from March 1st through March 29th, we will look at "our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness" and what these might mean in our community of faith.

Also beginning on Sunday, March 8, the Church Chat time will begin a 4 week video-study entitled *Opening Ourselves to Grace*. We will examine basic spiritual practices of the Christian faith from a Wesleyan perspective. Taking on additional spiritual practices is a common response to the season of Lent. This study assists each of us in faith formation and development.

I offer this prayer for you and our church this Lenten season:

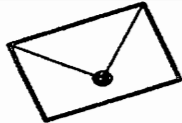

The Call from the Scriptures

• *Just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. (Matthew 25:40)*

• *Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interest of others. Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 2:4-5)*

You are invited to join a new ministry to care for our church members. We want to start a discussion on how to reach those who are homebound or in nursing homes, those who are bereaved, and those who have moved away to let them know we care and are here for them. The goal is that the bereaved, the ill, the lonely, and the homebound will experience God's goodness through the kindness of others. The Membership Care Committee is not a substitute for the role of ordained clergy, but is rather a mission of the caring church.

Through prayer, personal visits, reassuring phone calls, and card ministry, Membership Care volunteers will contact anyone needing encouragement, comfort, or reassurance that they are still connected to the church. Under the direction of the pastor, volunteers may offer Holy Communion to those who desire to receive it. Church members are encouraged to let us know of persons who are in need of our care.

Formal training will be given to all volunteers. Topics will cover the importance of confidentiality, basic guidelines for visitation, and how to respond to various situations. Volunteers will meet monthly to share concerns, pray for those in need, and determine how to meet the needs of those in our care.
