PASTOR TO PEOPLE

Over the past weeks, while several of our youth were participating in Confirmation Class, several adults mentioned that they would appreciate a class about United Methodism. There is a very good video-based study entitled "What Does It Mean to Be United Methodist?" Over five weeks, the sessions explore Wesleyan heritage, theology, and worship. I'll be leading the class during the Sunday School hour starting May 20th. We will meet on the second floor of the Christian Education building.

This is the day often spoken of as being the birth of the Church with the fullness of God's promises in Christ Jesus.
