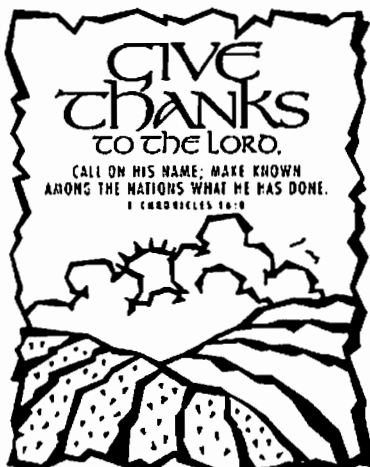

PASTOR TO PEOPLE

Each month, when I turn the calendar page, I get amazed at how quickly the time has passed since Judy and I moved to Poteau. And now we are entering into the season when church activities become even more prevalent. Before we know it there will be a Living Nativity scene outside the church doors, a choir cantata in the sanctuary, and the greens will have been hung. But before I get ahead of myself, it is also the season of giving thanks. Oh wait, should that season ever really end?

The psalms are filled with words of gratitude and thanks to the God who is Creator of life and the Redeemer of the exiles. We are reminded to give thanks to God, for God's nature is one of goodness and faithfulness. 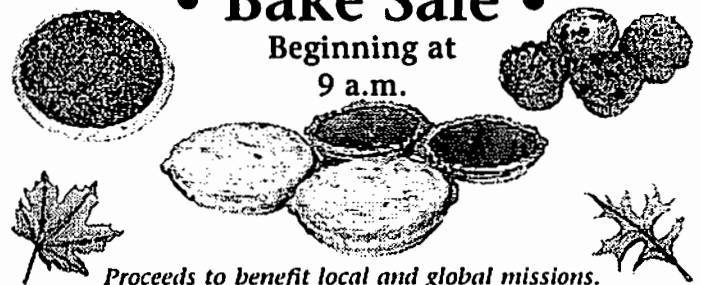
