At this meeting goals are discussed and statistical reports are given that help show the connection between the local and universal church. This year's conference will be on November 6 at 7:30 p.m.

I say all this to confess the "surprise" I receive every year when the dates are distributed. It is a prompting to complete some projects that have been started and to begin some that have been delayed. Things that I have put off until later, can no longer be set aside. Nominations and budget work have to move forward. Names and numbers that can sometimes be overwhelming, begin to become representative of opportunities to serve God and neighbor. Committee work that sometimes is tiresome, offers the chance to share personal gifts and talents. Preparing once again for charge conference can nudge a church forward and to look to the future.

Your responses will then be considered by the nominations committee as that group completes its work.

Several committees and task forces are already meeting, making plans for the future. Discussions are ongoing about new classes and studies, the use of space, and effective hospitality and welcoming of visitors. Ideas and creativity are welcomed and my door is open. There will also be another after-church dinner and conversation in the near future. More information will be available soon. In the meantime, I appreciate the many ways that this congregation ministers to the community of Poteau and the world.

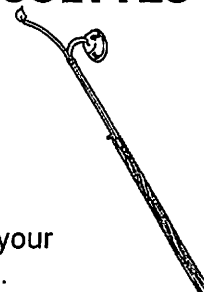
